Benchmark 1: A Stable Careers Programme	A well-structured, multi-year plan (Y7–Y11) that embeds careers-related learning into the wider PSHE provision. This includes: Year 7: Introduction to enterprise and career aspiration lessons in "Ecoden" and "Exploring Me and My Future" Year 9–11: Lessons on budgeting, money management, job roles, political literacy, and first aid Regular assessments and structured skills development show stability and progression	Include explicit references to the school careers policy or link PSHE outcomes to the school's CEIAG strategy to strengthen this benchmark.	In addition to linking PSHE outcomes to the school's CEIAG strategy, embed Unifrog into PDL lessons across Years 7–11 to ensure continuity in careers education. Students can track progress, log interactions, and explore options year-on-year through the platform's "Careers Library" and "Personality Profile" tools.
