For week 1&2 Classwork I will:

- Learn how to use the preterite tense when referring to holiday activities.
- Learn how to form the preterite tense for regular -AR, -ER, -IR verbs.
- Learn how to use different structures to give opinions.

Listening – To listen out for opinions.
Reading and Speaking – To read out a text about Barcelona and note specific details.
Writing – To write 4 long sentences imagining that you have visited Barcelona.

For week 3&4 Classwork I will:

- Learn how to describe where you stayed in detail.
- Learn how to form the imperfect tense to describe in the past
- Learn how to work out the meaning of new words

To Build confidence

Pair/Group work

Listening – To listen for key information.
Reading and Speaking – To read over 80 words and answer questions. Answer questions using the imperfect.
Writing – Using information provided write a description of the hotel.

For week 5&6 Classwork I will:

- Learn how to make a reservation.
- Learn how to describe a positive and negative holiday event.

To Build confidence

Pair/Group work

Listening – To listen to a conversation and listen for details.
Reading and Speaking – To understand and being able to ask statements about accommodation.
Writing – To write a dialogue.

For week 7 Classwork I will:

- Learn how to use 3 tenses together, the present, preterite and the imperfect.

Listening – To decide if statements are Positive, Negative or both.
Reading and Speaking – To understand 6 long texts and answer questions.
Writing – To translate into Spanish an 80-word piece.
