## **Overview of the KS3 Curriculum - Head, Heart & Hand**

The knowledge and skills we want our students to learn and develop at Malbank School is our core purpose. We have been reviewing our curriculum provision in Key Stage 3 to ensure that our students have the very best opportunity to make progress and be the best that they can be. Identifying what they need to learn and the order in which they learn knowledge and develop skills is key to this.

At Malbank, we believe that there should be clarity and consistency so that staff and students are clear on what knowledge and skills should be taught and learned in each curriculum area, academic year, topic and in each lesson.

To support with this, we have introduced and are now embedding the Head, Heart & Hand curriculum model which takes into account all aspects of the National Curriculum.

**Head** represents the key knowledge to be learned.

**Heart** represents the key personal skills that will be developed and also help students to understand the world around them.

**Hand** represents the key skills that will be developed as a result of the knowledge learned.

I am keen that you as parents and carers have the opportunity to share in the Head, Heart & Hand curriculum so that you have an awareness of what your children are learning about, what new knowledge they are covering and what new skills they are developing.
