- recognition of the role Judaism plays in shaping British identity

HAND



- outline the diverse outlooks within Judaism (e.g. Orthodox, Reform and Liberal)
- how teachings and sacred writings influence belief
- explain how belief influences behaviour

Unit Intent

In this course, you are introduced to **Judaism** as one of the diverse religious traditions and beliefs in Great Britain today (you should, however, be aware that the main religious tradition in Great Britain is Christianity). You will study the **beliefs and teachings** of Judaism and their basis in Jewish sources of wisdom and authority. You will also be encouraged to see how these teachings appear in Jewish scripture and/or sacred texts and how these beliefs and teachings influence individuals, communities and societies. You should understand throughout that there are **common** and **different** views within Judaism in the way beliefs and teachings are understood and expressed: for example, Orthodox, Reform and Liberal Judaism.
