



## SCHOOL UNIFORM

Uniform shows that you are part of a community. Wearing it with pride is important and we are consistent in our expectations. All students should be in correct uniform for school.

**All clothing and equipment should be clearly labelled with the owner's name.  
The school cannot be held responsible for any losses.**

## UNIFORM EXPECTATIONS AT MALBANK

**Correct Malbank school uniform consists of the following:**

- **Official School Blazer** (Navy in colour with embroidered school badge – available from National Schoolwear Hanley 01782272991 and 'School's In' 01270 618957)
- **White school shirt** (short,  $\frac{3}{4}$  or long sleeves are equally acceptable) This must be a collared, button up shirt worn tucked in that will allow you to wear a tie – not a white polo shirt.
- **School house tie** these can be bought from school



- **Grey school trousers** - please note “grey” includes “charcoal” as worn by many current students. Male and female fit trousers should be tailored and have a zip and button. No black trousers are allowed.
- **Low-thigh to knee length grey pleated school skirt** available from any distributor– must have pleats and must not be stretch material.
- One of either plain black or grey coloured **tights** or black or grey knee/ankle length **socks**. (not both)
- **Plain black leather** school shoes (No canvas, no other colours, no metal or plastic lace tags, no bubble, air or coloured soles, no boots, no heels)

## Students may also:

- **Choose to wear a white t-shirt or base layer for comfort under their white shirt.** This must be white, have no visible logos and must not be visible.
- **Wear a coat over their blazer during cold weather when outside the building.** (Hoodies are not an acceptable replacement for a coat – further details later in this document)
- **Wear one earring stud** in each ear.
- **Wear a clear plastic retainer** for any facial piercing or additional earrings. New facial piercings should not be obtained during school term time. New piercings that require a student to wear a metal stud will not be accommodated.



## **Uniform and clothing which is not allowed:**

- Over the knee socks
- Earrings other than studs - only **one** pair of ear studs. No hoops, flesh tunnels or ear bars.
- Hoodies or other jumpers worn over the top of school uniform. Hoodies are not a replacement for a school coat.
- No chains or necklaces on view.
- No bracelets unless worn for medical or religious reasons.
- No earphones or earpods on show at any point during the school day.

## **Additional clarification regarding student appearance:**

- Make up must be natural looking - no false eyelashes
- No nail extensions should be worn to school
- Hair – all natural colours are acceptable (no pink, blue or purple etc.) • No patterns shaved into hair e.g. zig zags or logos
- Jewellery – one small ring is acceptable.
- Uniform must not be rolled including blazer sleeves or skirts.

**Examples of clothing that are not acceptable (this is not an exhaustive list but indicative of the types of clothing we will not allow):**



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## PE Kit

- The Royal blue polo shirt with Malbank School logo is compulsory
- The black micro fleece with Malbank school logo is recommended to add warmth during the winter. Plain black or blue base layers/jumper/fleece can be worn underneath the blue polo as an alternative
- Black shorts black tracksuit bottoms or black leggings (for girls) may be worn. They do not need to have the Malbank School logo but must be plain black and free from large brand names/logos
- Plain black or white sports sock must be worn
- Trainers must be suitable for purpose. Pumps and fashion trainers ( e.g. converse) do not offer adequate grip support and protection
- Studded boots for football and rugby on the playing fields is highly recommended for grip and support especially during the winter months
- Shin Pads are recommended to be used for football and hockey, gum shields are also recommended to be used for rugby (these are compulsory when representing school in extra curricular activities in fully competitive matches)
